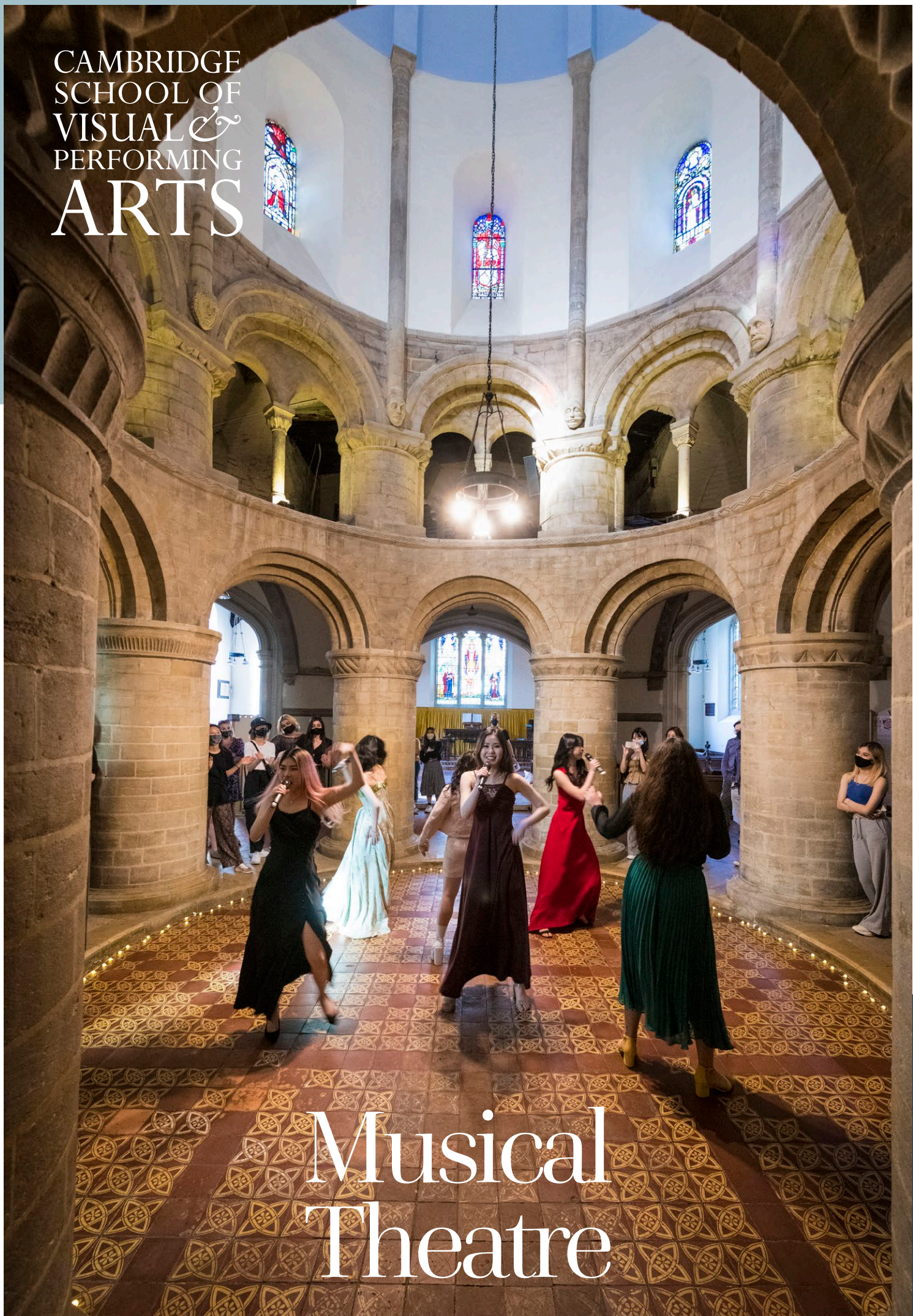

TUITION

25+ Hours of tuition comprised of workshops and rehearsals working towards a final performance.
